Screening, Brief Intervention, Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) is an approach that you can use during your routine visits to determine if a person's alcohol or drug use may be causing potential harm to his/her overall health.

How does SBIRT work?

SBIRT builds on the screening approach used in healthcare for a range of lifestyle issues. With SBIRT, seeing for drug and alcohol uses becomes part of every exam an/or visit. With simple tools it can be easy to implement into your setting.
