Wisdom Powell Hammond, Ph.D., is an assistant professor of health behavior and health education at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill's (UNC) Gillings School of Global Public Health. Additionally, she is also member of UNC Lineberger Comprehensive Cancer Center. Dr. Powell Hammond conducts research that spans the individual, psychological factors that affect health behavior in minority populations. She examines issues including how sociological and environmental issues affect health status, health behavior and the use of health care. Dr. Powell Hammond received her PhD in Clinical Psychology from the University of Michigan and MPH degree from the University of Michigan School of Public Health.
